# IMPACT YOUR SUPPORT MADE POSSIBLE



### Community Health and Nutrition

With Save the Children's increased immunization coverage in West and Central Sumba, 2,922 girls and boys under the age of 5 received critical childhood vaccinations that will help prevent child deaths within hard-to-reach areas.



### Community Education

In West Sumba, 1,376 parents and caregivers received at-home services and support, under new in-person guidelines, that helped with fostering a positive at-home learning environment and care and counsel on health-related topics.

## ORIS DOESN'T HAVE TO WORRY ABOUT A FUTURE WITHOUT AN EDUCATION

Oris, like many children living in picturesque Indonesia, loved attending school. He would walk for miles through the hills because he wanted, more than anything, to learn everything he could so he could one day become a teacher.

But then Oris got sick. And he had to drop out of school. As he recovered, Oris felt like he'd fallen so far behind that it would be impossible to catch up. In dismay, he decided to drop out, and his dreams dwindled.

But then two Save the Children workers came to visit one day, asking that Oris return to school. The little boy was shocked that anyone cared so much.

With joy, Oris agreed immediately. He was so moved by the care and concern — knowing that people were fighting for his future.

### Adolescents' Development

Twenty-one parents of teens in four villages participated in regular discussions with their children about sexual and reproductive health challenges and concerns. Participants agree that these discussions will help equip parents to better understand and care for their children as they transition to adulthood.



### Early Childhood Development

Twenty-six local early childhood educators received a first time ever training accompanying resources that promoted gender equality and raised awareness about gender-sensitive practices that will help minimize the perceived gap between boys and girls.
