

School Health and Nutrition

To ensure children were healthy and ready to learn, 8.35 tons of food supplies and cooking utensils were provided to 20 schools in order to provide food and sustenance to 6,119 girls and boys.



Early Childhood Education

1,440 children, parents and caregivers attended 30 community sessions that trained and equipped them with resources to create a fun and safe learning environment in the home.

Twelve-year-old Aicha didn't always care about going to school. Living with her mom and siblings, she would only go to school if she finished all her chores. Aicha's hope for the future was to simply get married.

But then Aicha started receiving letters from her sponsor encouraging her. Suddenly, Aicha started thinking that she could do more with her life. That she was worth more.

Today, Aicha wants to go to school because she dreams of one day becoming a nurse and helping the sick who are in her community. Her favorite subjects are math and reading. And she participates in reading clubs twice a week at her school.

Adolescents' Development

To prevent absences from school and to promote menstrual health, 300 teen girls in the community received menstrual hygiene kits (sanitary napkin, soap, underwear and ointments).



Community Education

In partnership with volunteers, 108 community members were trained and equipped to help 1,296 children improve their literacy skills and comprehension and develop a love for reading.


