Community Health

1,500 community health care workers and providers in Cochabamba were trained in infant and adolescent care to improve their ability to detect and prevent malnutrition.



Early Childhood Development

2,286 children successfully benefited from early childhood education programs in Cochabamba, increasing their abilities in social and literacy skills that will help prepare them to enroll in school.



Adolescents' Development

7,000 teens were reached throughout Cochabamba with sexual and reproductive health resources for the prevention of sexually transmitted diseases and teen pregnancy.



Child Protection

10,000 parents and caregivers were trained on "positive parenting" and how to provide a nurturing learning environment for their children at home. In addition, they received training that emphasized gender equality.
