

School Health and Nutrition

2,933 school-aged children in 4 local schools received art supplies — including paper, pencils, crayons and paint — that promoted mental and emotional healing and overall wellbeing.



Community Health

12 health care and social workers received first-aid training that equipped them with skills and knowledge to meet the social needs of children and community members affected by stress.



Adolescents' Development

1,976 teens participated in youth-led forums where they discussed their concerns about child safety and protection — as well as discovered their voices as they spoke out against discrimination and inequality.




Child Protection

65 community members were trained and equipped to mobilize grassroots efforts that promote child protection programs in new areas in order to reduce sexual violence and exploitation.

More Important Results!

5,951 children were assessed to determine their literacy levels in writing and reading comprehension.



92 teens who dropped out of school participated in Back-to-School programs that helped them re-enroll.



5 primary schools were outfitted with 1,755 reams of paper and with other learning and art supplies.
