Early Childhood Development

19 schools received refurbished or reconstructed washing facilities and latrines, along with important hygiene training that will help protect children from preventable diseases.



School Health and Nutrition

58,278 parents and caregivers were trained on the importance of health, nutrition and personal hygiene — while also receiving nutritious foods and ingredients to help them at home.



Community Education

70 schools were assessed and equipped with inclusion resources that promoted equal access to education and helped remove barriers to learning for children with disabilities.



Child Protection

48 children from 24 local schools participated in child protection camps, where they raised concerns about child safety issues in their schools — receiving guidance and training on how to address the concerns.

121 community leaders were trained in child protection and safety services that promoted child rights.
